On the Horizon

Clinical Operations Plans Soon Finalized and Approved

For the past several months, Transitional Work Groups (TWGs) have been convening to guide the development of Clinical Operations Plans (COPs). which are work plans specific to individual projects. COPs for four of BPHC's projects - including projects focusing on asthma, cardiovascular disease, diabetes, and Health Home at-risk patients - are in the final stages of development. The completion of these COPs brings us another step closer to launching our DSRIP projects this fall.

TWGs are reviewing plans and will pass them to the Quality and Care Innovation Sub-Committee for approval. With COPs approved, TWGs will evolve into Rapid Deployment Collaboratives. These groups will meet consistently throughout the DSRIP period to guide each project's implementation.

CSO and Institute Hosting PCBH Integration Project Orientation

BPHC's project 3.a.i, which focuses on co-locating and integrating primary care and behavioral health services, is quickly gaining momentum. The Institute for Family Health has assumed a leading role in the project planning and implementation, thanks to its expertise in the IMPACT model of service integration.

The Central Services Organization (CSO) and the Institute hosted an orientation for organizations participating in this project on September 30th. At the orientation, we presented on two different models of service integration, review the project plan, introduce the project's guidelines, expectations, and timeline, and discuss how participating organizations will receive support and guidance in the service integration process.

BPHC Members Attended DSRIP Symposium

On September 17th and 18th, representatives from BPHC's Central Services Organization and several member organizations attended a statewide DSRIP symposium designed to facilitate collaboration and sharing of best practices between New York State PPSs.

Discussion Sessions Resulted in Engagement Work Groups

PPS members from nearly 40 PPS member organizations recently convened in discussion sessions to explore the role of community-based services in our DSRIP projects. Work Groups grew out of these discussions sessions to develop strategies around community engagement, service coordination and integration, and interconnectivity.
